



'Boundless Compassion' is a six-week personal transformation process for developing and deepening compassion. It encourages, and inspires you to grow in the kind of love that




Answering the Contemplative Call: Five Steps on the Mystical Path (2013) By Carl McColman; author of 'The Big Book of

'The Garden Awakening' is an award-winning garden designer's unique union of a practical how-to book with stories and philosophy. This



In addition to being a prolific spiritual writer and the abbot of the premier Cistercian monastery in northern England during the 12th century, Aelred of Rievaulx somehow found the time to travel

extensively throughout the Anglo-Norman kingdom, acting as a mediator, a problem solver, and an adviser to kings. In this work, Truax focuses on the public career of Aelred of Rievaulx, placing him in his historical context, deepening the reader's understanding of his work and casting additional light on his underappreciated role as politician, mediator, and negotiator outside his abbey's walls.




Reading John for Dear Life:

The Wisdom of the Body:


A Contemplative Journey to Wholeness for Women (2017)
